Top 10 Ways to Prevent Bullying at School

Programs like peer mediation that place responsibility on the children to work out conflicts can increase bullying. (Adult victims of abuse are never asked to "work it out" with their tormentor, and children have an additional legal right to protections due to their developmental status.)

Talk regularly about school, their friendships and anything that might be troubling them. Ask them directly if they're being bullied and let them know you want to work together to help stop it. Discuss your own experiences of being bullied and how you got through it. Encourage them to call Kids Helpline and talk to a counsellor.

A typical state anti-bullying law requires a school to report, document and investigate bullying within a specific number of days. It also requires the school to take action to stop it. Many state laws list consequences for bullies. Some have a process for offering services like counseling to the victim and the bully.

Prevention of bullying. Once bullying has been identified, it's important to address the situation as soon as possible with the school, where appropriate measures and actions can be discussed and implemented. The Western Cape Education Department (WCED) has provided guidelines to schools on how to deal with bullying. Schools need to deal with the issue in line with codes of conduct, and intervene appropriately to support the victim and to change the behaviour of the culprit.

Express confidence that you, the adults at school, and your child will be able to find a solution. Ask your child to express his/ her thoughts and feelings about what happened; Explain that bullies seek to hurt and control. So your child must not let them know he is hurt by their behaviour.
